Council Highlights

These are some of the resolutions made at the July 23, 2013 regular council meeting of the Village of Heisler Council:

- To hire Nu Energy Group Edmonton to attend the village to complete a site assessment for possible solar energy installation on municipally owned buildings at a cost of \$490.00
- To write a letter to AB Environment—Council feels that an order is appropriate as opposed to a recommendation that Heisler hire a consultant to perform a leak detection survey for village water infrastructure
- Council discussed the amount of money that the village will designate to the future playground project. The CAO will designate \$25,000 in the 2014 operating budget, plus \$14,390.76 already donated/reserved for a total of \$39,390.76





NOMINATION DAY - Monday September 23, 2013

Eligibility: You are eligible for nomination if you meet ALL of the following criteria:

- 18 years of age on or before Nomination Day
- Canadian citizen
- Must have lived in the Village of Heisler for the 6 consecutive months immediately preceding Election Day
- Are not otherwise ineligible or disqualified
- ~Nomination forms must be delivered to the Village of Heisler administration office in person.

ELECTION DAY - Monday October 21, 2013

Eligibility – You are eligible to vote if you meet ALL of the following criteria:

- 18 years of age
- Canadian citizen
- Lived in Alberta for 6 consecutive months immediately preceding Election Day
- Resident of the Village of Heisler
- Provided the required proof of eligibility as required by Section 53 of the Local Authorities Election Act.

Note: The above condensed information is provided as assistance to the public only. For exact wording of the legislation, please refer to the Local Authorities Election Act.
