

## **Snow Removal Information**

Snow removal season is now upon us. Please remember that all owners of property are required to remove the snow, ice, dirt/debris from the sidewalk(s) adjacent to your property within **72 hours for residential and 24 hours for commercial** properties after the cessation of a snow fall (excluding Sundays and holidays) pursuant to the Snow Removal Bylaw #494-15. Please visit our website for more info at **www.villageofheisler.ca** or stop by the village office.



Snow Removal Bylaw #494-15, Section 6, Penalties and Enforcement —In the event of any person failing to comply with this bylaw, the Village of Heisler may carry out the removal of snow, ice, dirt, debris or other material or contract out the removal with all costs involved being charged to the owner of the said property.

~If you are going to be away, please ensure someone shovels your sidewalk.

~Blowing/Shoveling snow from boulevards/frontages onto the road is <u>not</u> permitted at anytime. Snow may be shovel from sidewalks onto the road if the grader has not cleared the road in front of the property.

~Please do not string electrical cords (block heaters, etc.) across sidewalks.



Please note that Public Works follows specific priorities as outlined in the Snow Removal Policy #3200 when removing snow from Village roads, etc. Snow removal is started as soon as possible to allow for residential/commercial and emergency access. The Policy can be found on our website at **www.villageofheisler.ca** and at the village office.

# More Collaboration Key to Region's Success

January 15, 2016 - For immediate release

The Flagstaff Intermunicipal Partnership (FIP) has been working together since 2003 to find local solutions for regional issues. Successful initiatives include: Regional Emergency Services Communications System; Regional SCADA System for Water Treatment Plants; Regional Assessment Review Board; Regional Subdivision and Development Appeal Board. In addition the communities have existing established partnerships in: Waste Management, Housing, FCSS, and RCMP advisory

FIP has now expanded the options to be examined in an effort to ensure the future sustainability of our region. A new process, known as the Regional Governance Project, has been developed with the following goals:

Ensure options for deeper collaboration are clearly superior to existing arrangement; and Ensure the options chosen are most appropriate given the future needs of today's citizens in the communities.

The Committee will be requesting the assistance of the public and stakeholders, local agencies, boards, commissions, municipal employees and elected officials, as well as seek the counsel and advice of Municipal Affairs and an impartial consultant to provide information and collect feedback to ensure that the most effective solutions are found for all of our citizens.

Why are we doing this now? In the past year we have seen two communities in our region move to Hamlet status. The Minister of Municipal Affairs is following what other provinces have done, and has made statements such as "municipalities will form partnerships" "new ways to integrate services" and "looking for ways to support municipalities to partner... funding is a great way"

To date, the Committee has approved a Terms of Reference for the Project and authorized staff to retain a consultant to ensure that the project momentum is maintained.

The Flagstaff Intermunicipal Partnership is a committee made up of representatives from all municipalities within the Flagstaff Region: Towns of Daysland, Hardisty, Killam and Sedgewick, the Villages of Alliance, Forestburg, Heisler and Lougheed and Flagstaff County.
