- To advertise the sale of various operable and inoperable equipment no longer needed by public works on Kijiji for \$500- purchaser must take all
- To approve the 2018 Flagstaff Intermunicipal Partnership budget with Heisler's requisition of \$678.93
- To adopt the Village of Heisler 2018 Capital and Operating Budget
- To transfer \$10,858.10 from General Reserves for unbudgeted expenses in 2017— \$7,387.60 for Utility Operator Services, \$2,142.85 for Heisler's portion of the creation of a Community and Regional Economic Support (CARES) grant application by Urban Systems as a Battle River Economic Opportunities Committee member, and \$1,327.65 to cover the cost of the debris cleanup on village property after the October 2017 windstorm

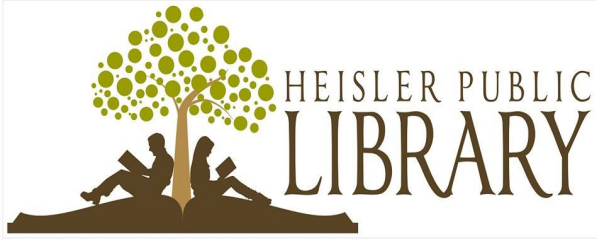

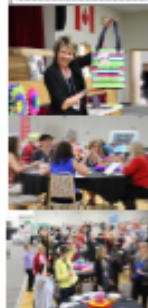
