




Something for Residents with a German Heritage!

The Heisler library is a proud member of Parkland Regional Library system, a cooperative of 50 public libraries across central Alberta. With your library membership, you are a member of 50 other unique libraries and have access to their services. You can also join other Alberta library systems. Alberta Wide Borrowing (ME Libraries). Library members can register with non-Parkland public libraries across the province to easily borrow physical items (not eContent) using their Parkland Regional Library card. Borrowed materials can be returned to any public library, too. All this for free!

Accessing eBooks on a Computer

- To read an eBook from the Alberta eBooks collection, you will need to install Adobe Digital Editions.
- 2. Authorize Digital Editions.
 - If you have the cloudLibrary app installed on your computer, Digital Editions will authorize with your information from the cloudLibrary app.
 - b. If you do not have cloudLibrary installed on your computer, authorize with an Adobe ID. (If the authorization window does not appear when you open Digital Editions click Help – Authorize Computer.)
- 3. Visit prl.cantookstation.com
- 4. Click Sign Up. Enter your library card and pin.
- 5. Click a title you want to borrow.
- 6. Click Borrow. Click Download. A file will appear at the bottom of your browser. Open the file.
- 7. The book will open in Digital Editions.

Transferring eBooks to eReaders

- 1. Follow the instructions for Accessing eBooks on a Computer.
- 2. Make sure Adobe Digital Editions is open.
- Connect your eReader to your computer with the device's USB cable. (Make sure your eReader is powered on before plugging it in.) Click *Connect* on your eReader. Your eReader will show up as a device in the left bar of Digital Editions.
- 4. Select the book you want to transfer and drag it to your device.
- 5. Eject your eReader from your computer and unplug the USB cable.

Accessing eBooks on your Tablet

- 1. Access the app store on your device and search for the free Bluefire Reader app. Install.
- Open the app. You will be prompted for an Adobe ID. If you don't have an Adobe ID create on by following the *Create a free Adobe ID* link. Input your information and tap *Authorize*. Once the app is authorized, exit out of Blufire Reader.
- 3. In the browser on your device go to prl.cantookstation.com.
- 4. Tap Sign Up. Enter your library card and pin.
- 5. Tap the title you want to borrow.
- 6. Tap Borrow. Tap Download. Tap Open in "Bluefire Reader".
- 7. The book will open in Bluefire Reader. Choose to read now or read later. Good Luck!









Friendly Reminder: DOG TAGS

Dog owners are reminded that annual dog tags are required for all dogs in the Village of Heisler for a fee. Tags allow village staff to find the owner quickly and efficiently.

If your pet is found without an identification tag, the animal will be sent to the Forestburg Vet Clinic and the owner will be subject to a fine-as of Dog Control Bylaw #468-12.

Tags are DUE by January 31, 2019



Regular dog license:\$15.00After Jan 31/19\$30.00Vicious dog license:\$100.00After Jan 31/119:\$200.00Replacement tags:\$5.00

Always pick up after your dog and keep it under proper control.

It is your responsibility and the law, violation may result in penalties!





- Everybody can learn it (even me)!




