Council Highlights

These are some of the resolutions made at the December 12, 2012 regular council meeting of the Village of Heisler Council:

- To give first reading to Bylaw #475-12, ATCO Electric Franchise Agreement Bylaw
 - To approve Policy #1204- Grant Endorsement Policy
 - To accept the ATCO Electric Franchise Renewal Agreement
 - To approve the Service Maintenance quote from Neptune Technologies for support and maintenance of the water meter reading soft and hardware in the amount of **\$2,553.08** for 2013
 - To approve the 2012 Heisler Staff Christmas gift budget in the amount of **\$350.00**
 - To accept the cost estimates from McNabb Construction for repairs to various protruding curb stops, repair costs will be included in the 2013 Capital/Operating budget
 - To accept the Muniware support agreement for 2013 in the amount of **\$247.96** per month
 - To approve the Flagstaff Regional Solid Waste Management Association 2013 budget in the amount of **\$2,442,070.52**, Heisler's 2013 requisition will be **\$21,493.06**

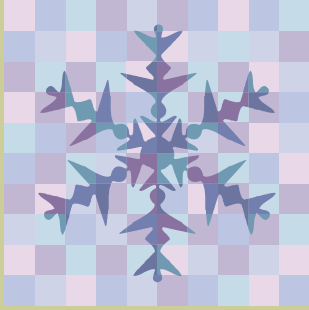

2012 A Year in Review

As the New Year is now upon us, the Council for the Village of Heisler would like to take some time to reflect on 2012.

Garry Reuther retired this fall after over 12 years as our Public Works Foreman. Calvin MacAhonic is now settling in as his successor.

There was one major infrastructure project that was completed; the sewer upgrade project in the alley between Stewart Street and Brownlee Street. After a couple of weeks working in the mud, the contractor finished a project that has been years in the making. We will be starting the next phase of the sewer upgrade project in 2013. Major repairs were made to the sewer lift station on the west side of the Village; those repairs should help keep the lift station running smoothly for years to come. Roads were repaired with cold mix at various locations throughout the village, gravel was laid on Strom Street, and a couple of alleys were revitalized with new shale.

We've received a lot of support from ATCO Electric in 2012 with a \$1000 donation to the future playground. We've signed an agreement with ATCO Electric to install 3 decorative lights along the walking path and a power source at the new municipal park at a discounted cost. The park has been named "Pioneers of Flagstaff" Park, and signs will be erected in the park bearing its new name in the coming months.

Other beautification projects were undertaken such as painting in the water treatment plant, and painting of the bus shelter on Haultain Ave. The annual planting of flowers took place this spring and trees were planted in various locations around the village. Public Works painted the lines for the crosswalks and parking spaces.

Heisler will no longer be a part of the Flagstaff Regional Solid Waste Management Association as of 2017. Council began the steps to withdrawal from the Association in the summer however; the agreement states that anyone wishing to withdrawal can only do so every five years and as September of 2011 was the last date for withdrawal application, we are bound to the agreement until the end of 2016.

Our little hotel sold to a new owner in the summer and they have asked the Village of Heisler for Municipal Historic Resource designation...a first in our fine village.

As Council for the Village of Heisler, we wish all the very best to our residents, have a wonderful 2013!
