If your pet is found without an identification tag, the animal will be sent to the Forestburg Vet Clinic and the owner will be subject to a fine -Dog Control Bylaw #468-12

Attention Heisler Property Owners/Occupants:

Snow removal season is now upon us. Please remember that all owners of property are required to remove the snow, ice, dirt/debris from the sidewalk adjacent to your property within 72 hours for residential and 24 hours for commercial properties after the cessation of a snow fall (excluding Sundays and holidays) pursuant to the Snow Removal Bylaw #494-15. ~If you are going to be away, please ensure someone shovels your sidewalk.

~Blowing/Shoveling snow from boulevards/frontages onto the road is not permitted at anytime. Snow may be shovel from sidewalks onto the road if the grader has not cleared the road in front of the property.

~Please do not string electrical cords (block heaters, etc.) across sidewalks.



Please note that Public Works follows specific priorities as outlined in the Snow Removal Policy #3200 when removing snow from Village roads, etc. Snow removal is started as soon as possible to allow for residential/commercial and emergency access. 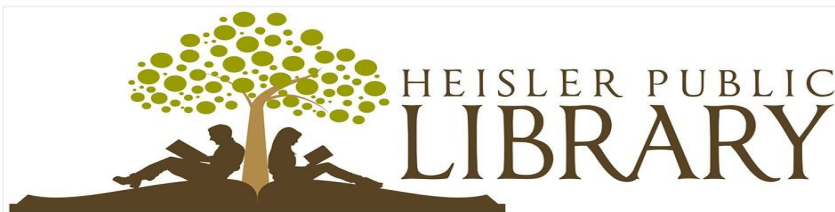

- Education, religion, occupation or trades
- Names of your neighbours and/or hired help
- Community interests, sports, hobbies, awards and special achievements
- Agriculture, ranching, businesses or government involvement
- Armed forces service: past and present, when and where served
- Natural phenomenon: floods, fires, storms, etc. Include impact on family
- Special stories or memories: favourite memories or best stories about events, incidents or characters in your family, church, club, business or community

Please indicate who has written the story. The publication committee reserves the right to edit your stories for the purpose of length or repetition, however we will keep the stories as close as possible to what you have provided.

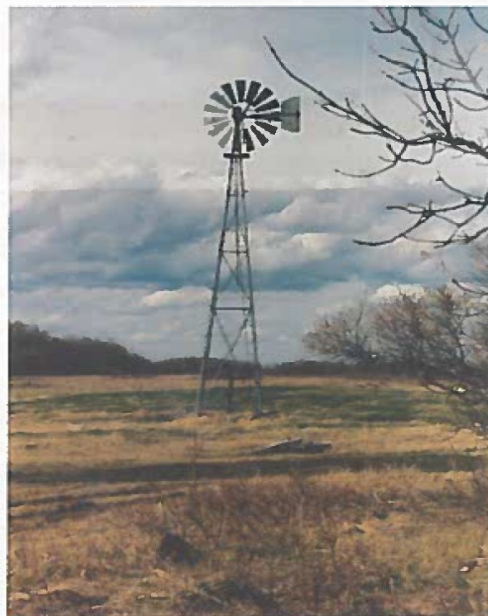

Mattress Recycling

Mattresses are one of the most problematic materials to enter the Landfill. Mattresses compact at a rate 400% less than normal garbage. The steel coil springs inside a mattress frequently get wrapped around our equipment during compaction and can cause major damage.

Flagstaff Waste is proud to introduce mattresses to the growing list of recycled products. Recycling mattresses saves energy, and reduces waste, greenhouse gases and the use of natural resources. FRSWMA is partnering with Re-Matt, who can recycle a mattress into 95%-100% of its raw materials and then into reusable products.

As of January 1st, 2016, all mattresses collected by Flagstaff Waste will be sent to Re-Matt for recycling. A fee of \$15 per mattress will be collected at the main Landfill and at all Transfer Sites, to recover recycling costs.

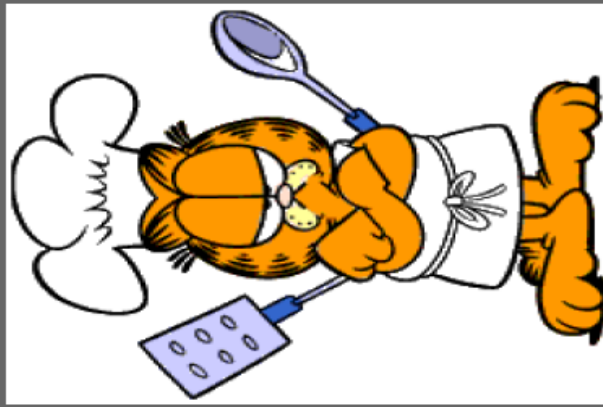
