Dear constituent

While the global economic recovery remains fragile, as demonstrated by the tremendous challenges facing Europe and the United States, our Government remains squarely focused on jobs and the economy.

That's why we are working hard to implement Economic Action Plan 2012 (the 2012 federal budget) – a prudent, long-term plan to grow Canada's economy, create jobs and get back to balanced budgets.

With the help of our Government's Economic Action Plan, Canada's economy has performed well relative to other countries in recent years. Job creation in Canada has been the strongest among all G-7 countries (over three-quarters of a million net new jobs created since July 2009), economic growth leads the G-7 (as forecasted by independent organizations like the International Monetary Fund and Organization for Economic Co-operation) and we have the lowest debt level ratio in the G-7 by far.

To all Village of Heisler Utility Customers:

Village Council has found it necessary to increase the monthly fee for garbage collection due to the substantial increase in the Flagstaff Regional Solid Waste Management Association requisition for 2012. Flagstaff Regional Solid Waste Management Association is responsible for the management and operations of the landfill and transfer station sites within Flagstaff County and is also responsible for garbage collection and recycling in our region and the Village of Heisler is a member of the Association.

Due to prior period losses and the need to start funding for future landfill/transfer station costs, we have seen an increase of 70.4% in our requisition. The requisition for 2011 was \$12,723.36 and the requisition for 2012 is \$21,684.17. As this increase in requisition needs to be made up by the end of the year a monthly increase of \$6.25, (\$12.50/bi-monthly bill) has had to be initiated.

The rates charged by the Village for water, sewer and garbage are based on cost recovery so that no costs for these services are reflected in our tax rate. Council feels strongly that these services should be funded on a "user pay" basis.

For your information....

Council also feels that it is important that residents know that Flagstaff Regional Solid Waste Management is proposing to close the transfer station to the public in Heisler, and Sedgewick and use them to stage their trucks.

They are also proposing to close the transfer stations at Galahad, Science Hill, Rosalind, Lougheed, and Strome from FRSWMA use and upgrade Daysland, Killam, Hardisty, Alliance and Forestburg transfer sites to 'regional' transfer sites. We will keep our residents informed should any changes happen.

Your Land, Your Water, Your Voice

What we heard from you about the place you live

As summer arrives, all of us here at the Battle River Watershed Alliance (BRWA) are reflecting on the amazing opportunity we had this past year to travel across east-central Alberta and talk with the wonderful people who live here. Taking Care of our Land and Water

Watershed management in east-central Alberta

In 2011, the BRWA released *Our Battle: State of the Battle River and Sounding Creek Watersheds Report 2011*. An online version of the report is available on our website. This report provides a snapshot of the current ecological, social and economic health of our watersheds; it also acts as a catalyst to start talking about what we want our watersheds to look like and what actions we need to take to get there.

This year marks the beginning of the BRWA's watershed management planning process, which is all about developing management recommendations that lead to tangible actions that support the ecological, social and economic sustainability of our watersheds. Visit our website to read the Terms of Reference that will guide this process.

Here's what we'll be working on over the coming year:

Working to Improve Water Quality

Coming up with collective solutions to water quality issues

Over the coming year, one of the key components of our watershed that we want to focus on is water quality. In particular, we want to get a handle on high nutrient levels in our rivers, streams, lakes and wetlands. This year we'll be focusing our attention on nutrients and other pollutants coming from "non-point" sources; this includes pollution entering our water bodies and waterways through storm water runoff from our communities and surface water runoff from the countryside.

We want to learn more about the good work that is already being done and work together to come up with solutions to improve water quality and nutrient management in our watersheds. We'll be hosting a number of workshops in 2012/13 to talk with you about what collective actions are possible. The first round of workshops will take place in September. Stay tuned for more information about workshops near you!

Planning For Extremes

Developing strategies to thrive in times of water shortage and drought

In 2011, the BRWA began work on policy research related to issues of drought and water shortages in the Battle River and Sounding Creek watersheds. This coming year, work will continue with the development of policy recommendations and implementation guidelines for drought management in our watersheds.

Over the next year, we will be hosting a number of workshops to have conversations with you about drought policy recommendations and implementation guidelines that you would like to see put in place. The first round of workshops will take place in August. Stay tuned for dates and times for a workshop near you!
