These are some of the draft resolutions made at the June 17, 2014 regular council meeting and June 19, 2014 special council meeting of the Village of Heisler Council:

~June 17th

- To adopt the Municipal Emergency Plan that includes Policies #1300 & 1301 and Procedures #1302-1306
- To accept the employment agreement for summer public works assistance with Cashton MacAhonic—starting June 19 and ending August 29/14
- To sign the amended agreement for the Basic Municipal Transportation Grant with Alberta Municipal Affairs
- To pay Calvin MacAhonic's expenses in the amount of \$120.00 for purchasing 2 toilets for the campground washrooms
- To pay Mayor, Dennis Steil's meeting and travel expenses from Feb 24-May 22/14 in the amount of \$842.50
- To pay CAO, Amanda Howell 38 training hours for completing course material outside of work hours in the amount of \$877.80 minus payroll deductions

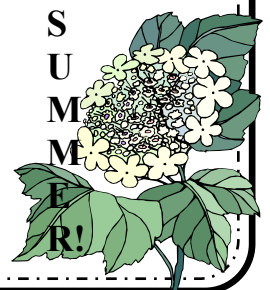

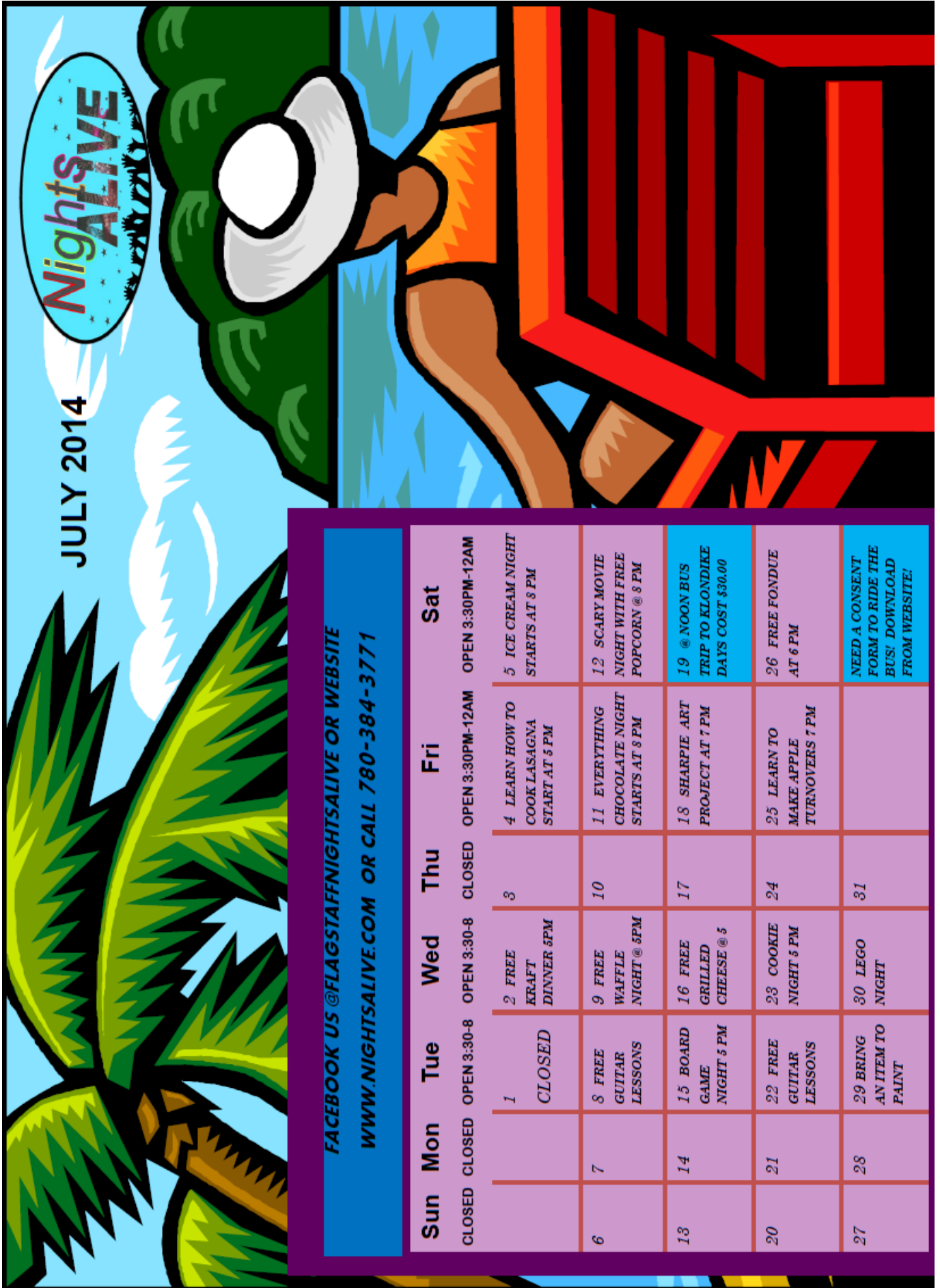

Dear Constituent:

I am pleased to inform you of the opening of a call for proposals for the Enabling Accessibility Fund, or EAF. Our government is committed to creating jobs, economic growth and long-term prosperity all across Canada and right here in Vegreville – Wainwright. I hope organizations in our community will use this opportunity to submit their proposals for projects that help improve accessibility. This is especially important to help accommodate the large numbers of seniors who would benefit from easier accessibility.

The call for proposals under EAF's small projects component opened on June 20, 2014, and closes on August 2, 2014. Under this call for proposals, organizations can receive a grant of up to \$50,000 for projects. In 2013, our government extended the Enabling Accessibility Fund on an ongoing basis at \$15 million per year to improve accessibility in facilities across Canada, including workplaces. Budget 2014 builds on initiatives which support the inclusion and participation of Canadians with disabilities in their communities and workplaces.

Examples of eligible projects could include:

- renovations to widen hallways and doorways;
- installing elevators;
- installing automated power doors;
- replacing doorknobs that are difficult to grasp with accessible handles,
- installing accessible washrooms and showers;
- upgrading facilities that offer programs for adults and/or children with autism and other cognitive/intellectual impairments.

Eligible recipients for this call for proposals are:

- Not-for-profit organizations;
- Municipalities with a population under 125,000 as per census data;
- Aboriginal organizations (including band councils, tribal councils and self-government entities);
- Territorial governments.
- **Businesses are not eligible** for funding under this CFP.
