- Instruct Interim CAO to pursue training for the Public Works Foreman Assistant for the grader for a cost of up to \$3,000.00
- Instruct Interim CAO to contact an electrician to assess the Village fire siren with a limit of \$1,100.00
- Approve request from the Royal Purple to borrow picnic tables for the Martz auction on May 26/12.
- To have Councillor Tetz attend the Martz Auction and bid up to \$800.00 for a 4x8 utility trailer on behalf of the Village of Heisler

2012 ASSESSMENT & TAXATION NOTICES

Village of Heisler in the Province of Alberta

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 311 of the Municipal Government Act, Statutes of Alberta 2000, Chapter M-26 that the Village of Heisler has mailed combined Assessment and Taxation Notices to all persons appearing on the Assessment Roll as of May 31, 2012.

Any person who desires to object to the entry of his/her name or that of any other person upon the said roll or to the assessment value placed upon any property, must lodge his/her complaint(s) in writing on a form available online and/or at the Village Office and submit to the Clerk of the Assessment Review Board on or before July 30, 2012

A charge of \$50.00 is required for each residential assessment appeal and the maximum Assessment Review Board fee is required for commercial assessment. The fee is refundable if the Assessment Review Board makes a decision in favour of the complainant pursuant to Section 481(2) of the Municipal Government Act.

Assessment complaints, with applicable fee, can be forwarded to the Clerk of the Assessment Review Board, c/o the Village of Heisler, Box 60, Heisler, Alberta T0B 2A0.

All assessed persons are deemed to have received their notices as a result of this publication.

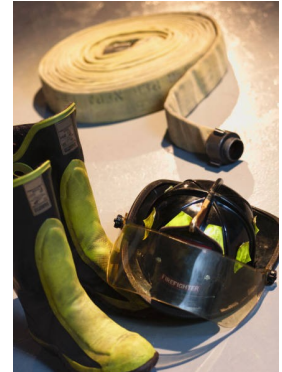

To all Village of Heisler Utility Customers:

Village Council has found it necessary to increase the monthly fee for garbage collection due to the substantial increase in the Flagstaff Regional Solid Waste Management Association requisition for 2012. Flagstaff Regional Solid Waste Management Association is responsible for the management and operations of the landfill and transfer station sites within Flagstaff County and is also responsible for garbage collection and recycling in our region and the Village of Heisler is a member of the Association.

Due to prior period losses and the need to start funding for future landfill/transfer station costs, we have seen an increase of 70.4% in our requisition. The requisition for 2011 was \$12,723.36 and the requisition for 2012 is \$21,684.17. As this increase in requisition needs to be made up by the end of the year a monthly increase of \$6.25, (\$12.50/bi-monthly bill) has had to be initiated.

The rates charged by the Village for water, sewer and garbage are based on cost recovery so that no costs for these services are reflected in our tax rate. Council feels strongly that these services should be funded on a "user pay" basis.

For your information.....

Council also feels that it is important that residents know that Flagstaff Regional Solid Waste Management is proposing to close the transfer station to the public in Heisler, and Sedgewick and use them to stage their trucks.

They are also proposing to close the transfer stations at Galahad, Science Hill, Rosalind, Loughed, and Strome from FRSWMA use and upgrade Daysland, Killam, Hardisty, Alliance and Forestburg transfer sites to 'regional' transfer sites. We will keep our residents informed should any changes happen.

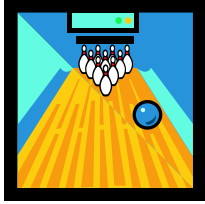

Night's Alive is coming alive but we need your help, we are a new organization funded by Flagstaff County. Nights Alive will serve youth ages 12 to 17, and provide them a safe environment to socialize and interact with other youth their age in the communities of Flagstaff.
