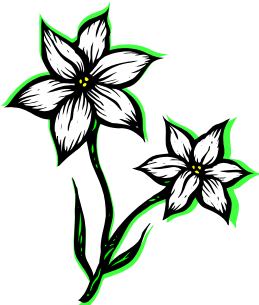

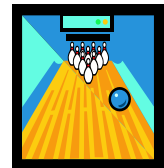
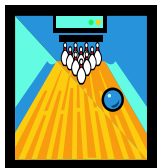

Reminder:

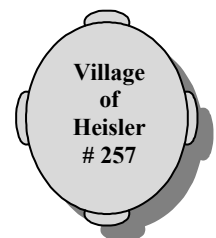
Citizens are reminded that dog tags are required for all dogs in the Village of Heisler for

We have 2 laptops equipped with high speed wireless internet for your convenience. Also available is a patron desktop computer.

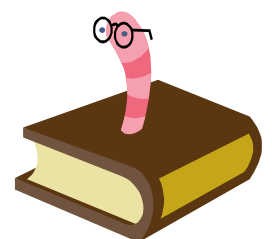
Large Print Books
