**MARCH 2018 NEWSLETTER**

These are some of the resolutions passed at the February 15, 2018 regular council meeting:

- To approve the Municipal Utility Services Policy #1215
- To approve the proposal and cost estimate of **\$20,000** from Vicinia Planning & Engagement for the creation of Heisler's Municipal Development Plan, subject to receipt of grant funds from the Alberta Community Partnership Program
- To approve the proposal and cost estimate of **\$132,502** from Bi-Systems for electrical upgrades at the water treatment plant, to be funded by the Federal Gas Tax Fund program
- To send letters to local societies/associations to garner potential interest for the management and operation of the Heisler campground and possibly the baseball diamonds
- To accept the resignation of Karen Wolbeck from and to appoint Lorie Zimmer to the Heisler Library Board

NEW! Municipal Utility Services Policy #1215

Property Owners/Developers now have an easy to read brochure (as part of the Municipal Utility Services Policy) that includes information compiled from other existing village documents into one place (documents such as the Agreements of the Land Sale Agreement for Lots Requiring Development Policy #1211, approved in July, 2011, and the Water, Sewer and Waste Bylaw #500-17, in place for many years).

The brochure clearly explains the responsibilities of the property owner and the Village with regards to installing and maintaining municipal utility services (water and sewer service lines).

*Please note that although the policy #1215 document is new, the rules/requirements outlined in the policy are not. Council did not change anything in Policy #1211 or Bylaw #500-17.

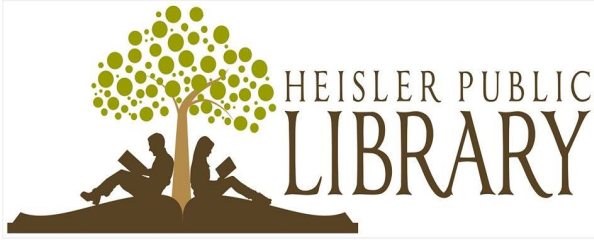

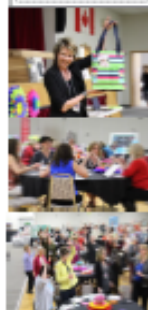
