These are some of the resolutions made at the April 18, 2013 regular council meeting of the Village of Heisler Council:

- To pass the Fees and Charges Bylaw #476-13
- To pass the Franchise Agreement with ATCO Electric Ltd. Bylaw #475-12
- To pass the Tax Rate Bylaw #479-13 for the 2013 tax year
- To place the final signatures on the Electric Distribution Agreement between ATCO Electric Ltd. and the Village of Heisler
- To write a letter to St. Martin's Parish to inquire if they are interested in having the parish designated as a Municipal Historic Resource
- To inform the Emergency Services Committee that Heisler is in favour of an All Hazards Mutual Aid Agreement with Flagstaff Municipalities
- To contact Select Engineering to start Phase 3 of the Sewer Upgrade project
- To transfer funds remaining from the community hall insurance in the amount of **\$3,717.06** to Recreation Reserves for future projects
- To transfer funds in the amount of **\$2,100** from Fire Reserves for payment to Heritage Heating for a new furnace for the fire hall

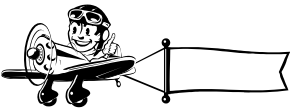

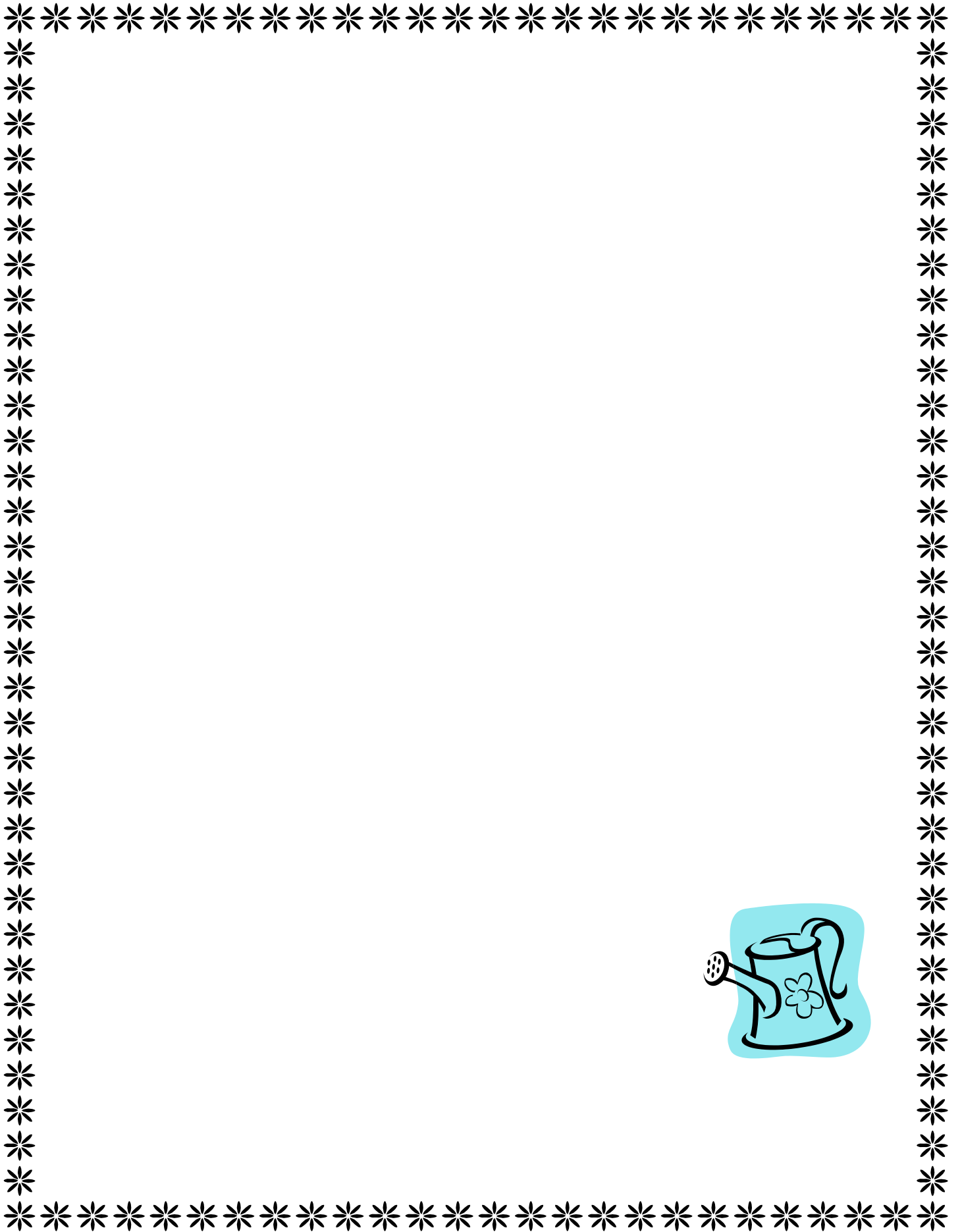

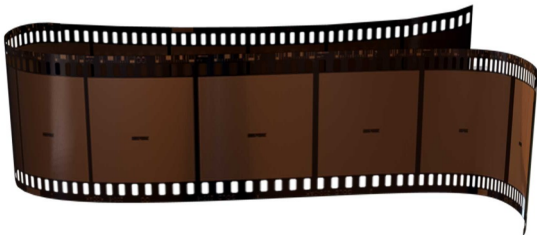

School Board votes for closure

There will be two fewer schools in Battle River School Division next fall, after an April 25 meeting at which members of the Battle River School Division Board of Trustees voted in favour of permanently closing Lougheed School and Rosalind School, effective June 28, 2013.

The closure discussions at these sites began as a result of ongoing low enrollments in those schools and the school division's growing concern that, given current economic and population realities, the current educational programming could not be maintained at those sites in the future. Both schools were projecting grade 1 to 9 enrollments in the low 40s next year.

"These were not easy decisions, or decisions that anyone on the Board made lightly," says Board Chair Doug Bowie. "Closure of a school would never be our first choice. We recognize that the impact of decisions such as these is far reaching and we've tried many things over the years to keep our smallest schools viable."

"But at the heart of our decision-making is our mandate to educate children. I know every Board member cast their vote based on what they believe to be in the best future educational interests of the children we serve."
