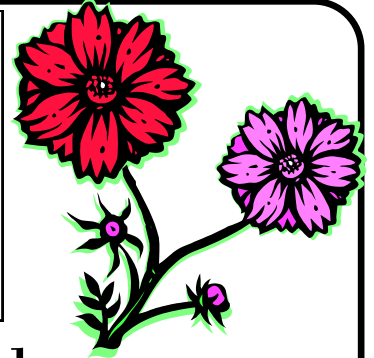

Council Highlights

These are some of the resolutions made at the April 15, 2014 regular council meeting of the Village of Heisler Council:

- To pass the 2014 Tax Rate Bylaw, #483-14 with a 3.94% increase to residential and non-residential municipal taxes, and an increase to minimum tax by \$100.00 to \$800.00.
- To instruct administration to advertise for a summer public works assistant, resumes accepted between May 5-15th.
- To instruct administration to purchase 2 “bump” signs and instruct public works to deal with drainage issues along Manning Ave, Councillor Bernard volunteered to dig a drainage swale, free of charge.
- To purchase one truckload of recycled concrete aggregate from Flagstaff Waste for \$130.00/load.
- To accept the revision of the 2014 operating budget (amend property tax revenue, input Education and Seniors Foundation requisitions) and instruct administration to transfer \$20,400 into General Reserves for future use.
- To accept the fee proposal from Brian King Professional Corporation—Audit Services for 2014-2017. 2014-\$7,150, 2015-\$7,300, 2016-\$7,450, 2017-\$7,600.

Municipal Sustainability Initiative - Capital Grant Allocation 2014:
\$139,035 ~MSI Capital and BMTG Grants have been rolled together into one.
Municipal Sustainability Initiative - Operating Grant Allocation 2014:
\$28,603 ~MSI Operating will discontinue within 2 years, the replacement program will require regional collaboration for receipt of grant funds.

~The provincial and federal governments are hammering out a new deal for Federal Gas Tax Grants, the anticipated allocation for 2014: **\$50,000**

~2014 Municipal Property Taxes are increasing by **3.94%** for all residential and non-residential properties.

~Minimum tax has been raised to **\$800.00**

~2014 Education Tax requisition for Heisler: **\$18,529.64**

~2014 Seniors Tax requisition for Heisler: **\$1,704.00**

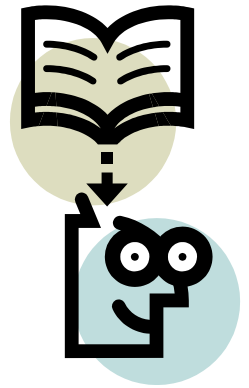

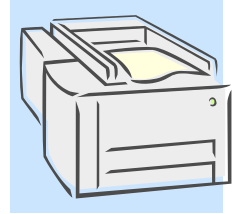

BRSD Board Meeting Highlights April 10, 2014

Members of the Battle River School Division Board of Trustees met on Thursday, April 10 and received information and updates which will help them make decisions on a number of items.

Last day of school

The Board of Trustees passed a motion to change the last day of the current school year to Friday, June 27, for both students and staff.

Initially the last day of school for staff was scheduled to be Monday, June 30. But the board made the decision to allow staff to finish on Friday instead. This decision applies to the current school year only.

By-election date May 5

Following Nomination Day on Monday, April 7, Battle River School Division is gearing up for a by-election, which will take place on Monday, May 5. Two candidates, Susan Chromik and Michael Fawcett, have put their names forward to fill the vacancy in Flagstaff County West.

Polling stations will be set up in Daysland, Forestburg, Galahad, Heisler and Strome on Election Day.

Annual staffing cycle is underway

The Board of Trustees heard a report on the beginning of the annual cycle of staffing schools for next year, which is now underway in BRSD. As a result of retirements, there are at least five principal positions to fill in the school division for the fall. Those positions are currently being advertised.

Satisfaction surveys complete

The Board of Trustees received a summary of the annual satisfaction survey results, which are based on input provided by students, parents and staff members during the months of February and March. More than 500 parents completed the survey, along with over 600 staff and more than 3000 students in grades 4 to 12. Here's a small sample of the feedback received:

92.11% of students in grades 4 to 6 strongly agree or agree that "teachers in my class say and do things that help me make my school work better."

91.74% of students in grades 7 to 12 strongly agree or agree that "teachers regularly use technology to help us learn in the classroom."

95.67% of teachers strongly agree or agree that "at my school healthy choices and lifestyles are promoted and role modeled".

92.69% of parents strongly agree or agree that "my child understands the school's expectations for student behaviour."

The board and school leaders use feedback such as this to help determine priorities and directions for the coming years. More detailed study of the survey results will take place in the months ahead.

Learning more about the FSLW program

Representatives of BRSD's Family School Liaison Worker and Inclusive Education programs met with the Board on April 10, to share information about the history and role of Family School Liaison workers in this division.

FSLWs provide support to students in need, as well as being a "bridge" between schools, students, families and community agencies. More than 290 students and families received individual support from one of BRSD's 5.5 FSLW positions last school year and a further 977 students were provided group or classroom presentations.

It was nice to see you!

Thanks to everyone who stopped by the BRSD booth at the Camrose and District Trade Show in mid-March. The Board of Trustees really appreciated seeing and hearing from so many constituents.
