Maintenance of the Ball Diamonds in DJW Park during the spring and summer of 2018

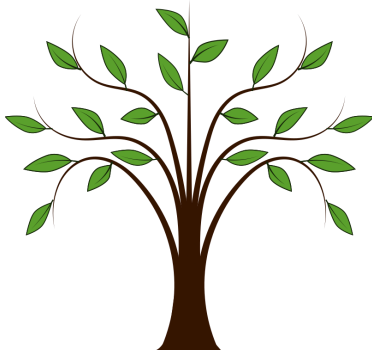
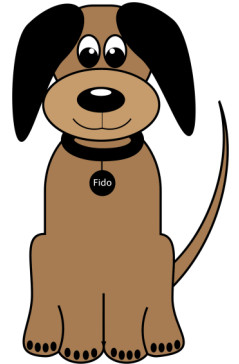
