Council Highlights

These are some of the resolutions made at the October 17, 2012 regular council meeting of the Village of Heisler Council:

- To approve Bylaw #472-12, Hawkers and Peddlers Bylaw
- To approve Bylaw #473-12, Village of Heisler Fire Bylaw, with revision from County to Flagstaff County
- To approve the County of Flagstaff Fire Services Agreement, with the letter from Regional Fire Chief, Kim Cannady pertaining to the Included equipment on the new fire truck that will be purchased for Heisler by Flagstaff County in 2013 attached to the agreement
- To maintain the ATCO Electric Distribution Revenue Franchise Fee at 7% for 2013
- To not accept the Electronic Bill Payment Services Creditor set-up and monthly fees from TD Canada Trust and Scotia Bank
- To accept the Electronic Bill Payment Services creditor information from CIBC, BMO and Credit Unions under the condition that there are no fees to sign up for and use these services

If you have a concern that you would like addressed by Council and wish to make a presentation, please contact the Village office one week prior to the meeting to fill out a delegation form. All meetings are open to the public.

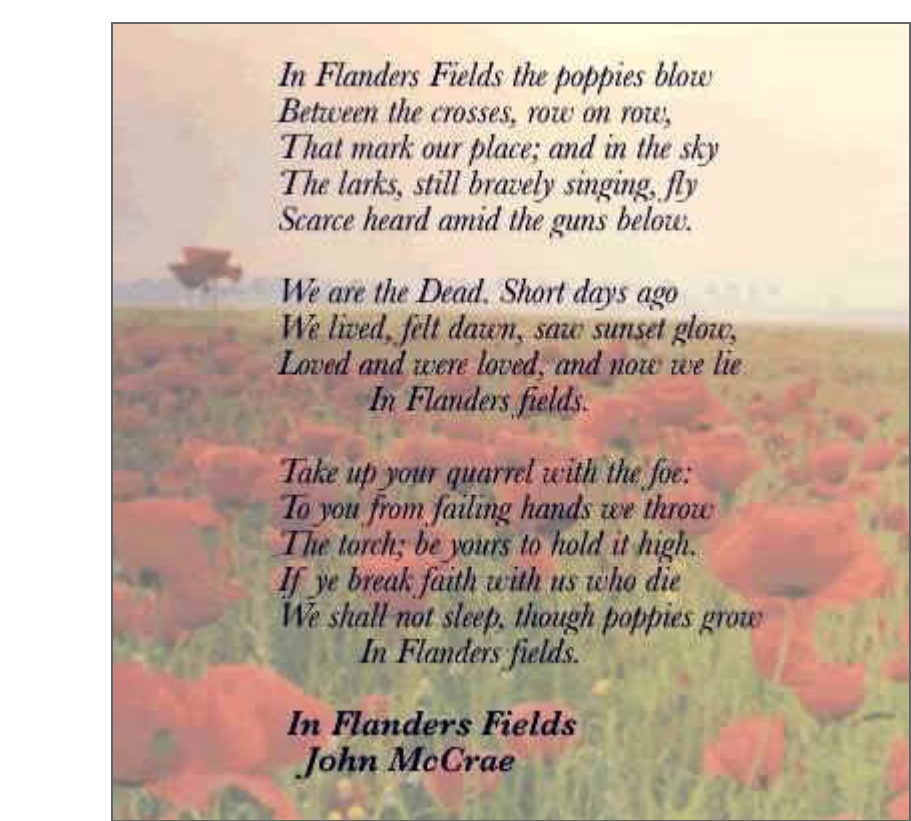

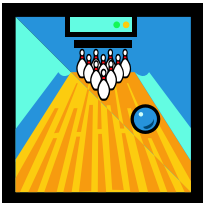

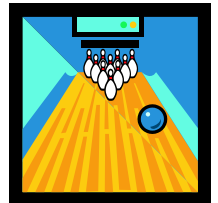

- Main Landfill– Located 6 1/2 miles north of Hwy 13 on RRD 122
