- To approve payment to Forestburg Transit Mix of **\$18,995.03**, GST included releasing the 10% holdback for the 2012 sewer project
- To accept amendments to and approve the All Hazards Mutual Aid agreement with Flagstaff municipalities
- To approve a letter of support request for the Flagstaff County— Killam Family Care Clinic Working Group
- To approve partial payment of **\$81,095.85**, GST included to Fort Garry Fire Trucks for the 2013 Freightliner fire truck
- To approve the request from the CAO to attend a two-day MuniWare User Group training session at a cost of \$370.00, plus mileage
- To approve the 2014 Parkland Regional Library Budget with \$1,132.50 as Heisler's requisition
- To approve payment to the FIP committee of **\$17,500** for the SCADA (remote monitoring system) at the Water Plant. The Federal Gas Tax Fund grant funds Heisler's portion




