(funded by MSI-\$110,000 and \$65,000-FGTF)
- Sanitary Sewer Improvements (manholes 19-20)– Replace sanitary sewer line & manholes
-Grant applied for \$103,850 –Project Cost to-date \$98,641
- Campground Upgrades – Purchase picnic tables, dead tree removal, painting, etc. at park, purchase shale for sites/road

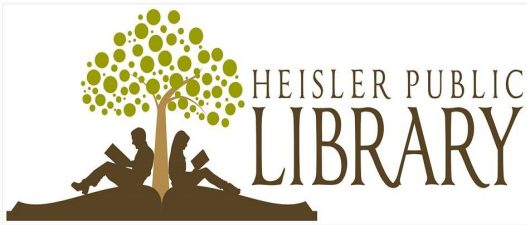

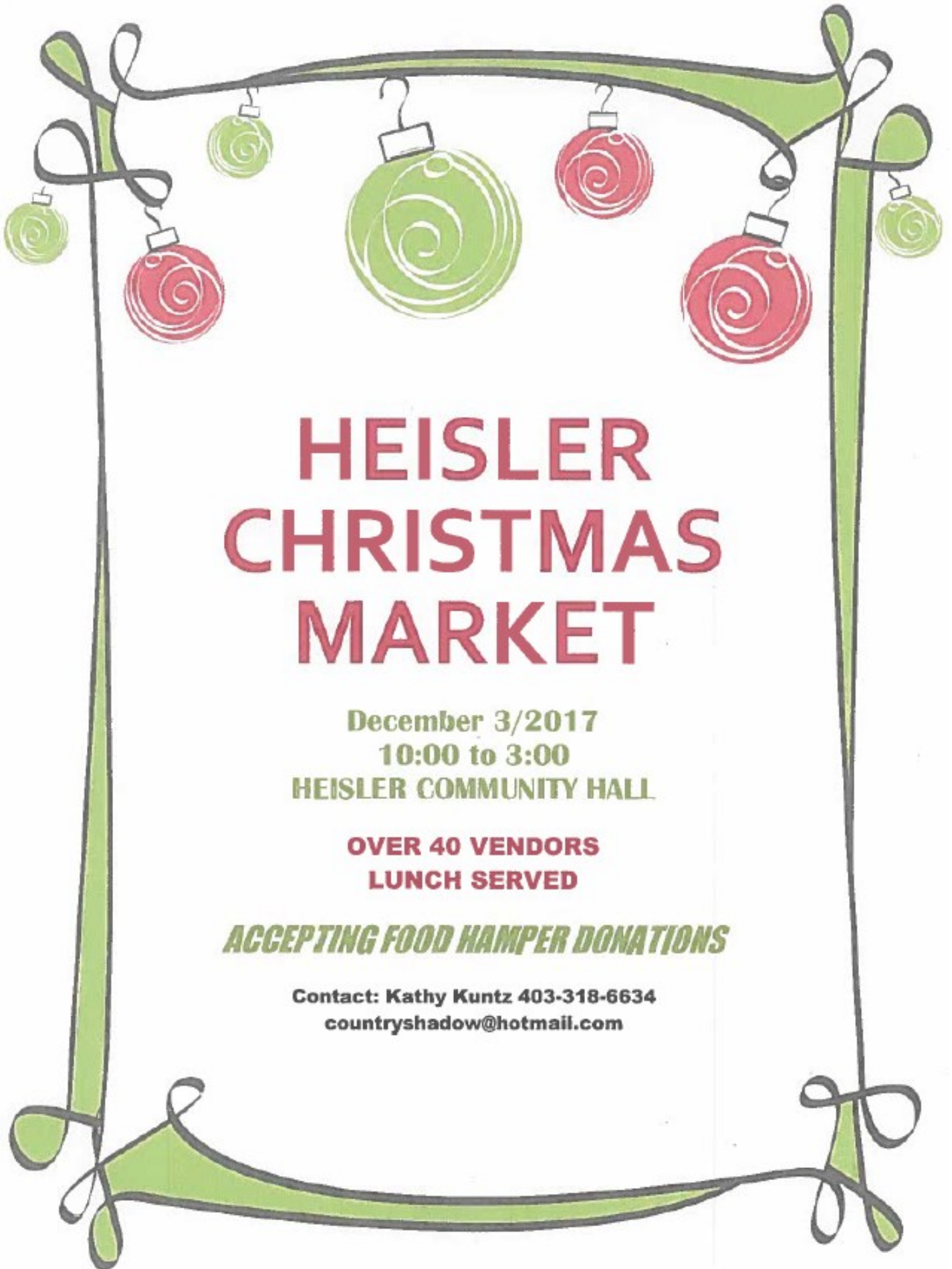
