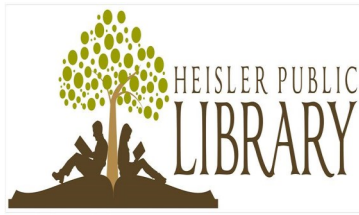

LIBRARY NEWSLETTER – OCTOBER

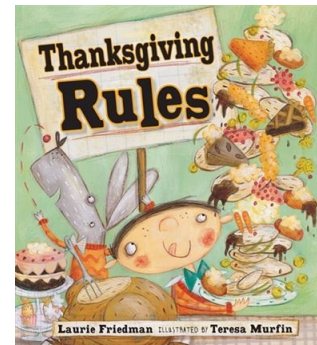
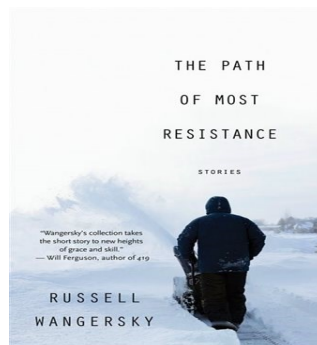
Find us on Facebook. We are The Heisler Public Library. Please 'like' & 'share' our page. Recommend any books you have read. Post your favorites.

The Heisler library is a proud member of Parkland Regional Library system, a cooperative of 50 public libraries across central Alberta. With your library membership, you are a member of 50 other unique libraries and have access to their services.

The library has three computers available to anyone. We have a copier if you wish to use for 25 cents per sheet. **There is no cost** to become a member and this allows you to request books, movies, DVDs and more from home and renew all items if necessary.

Thank you to local patrons who have donated cash to the library in September.

LEARN ABOUT HOOPLA

Bringing you hundreds of thousands of movies, music albums, comic books, and more!

Using the hoopla Website

1. Go to www.hoopladigital.com. Click the Get Started button in the middle of webpage.
2. Fill out the pop-up webform with your email and password and click Continue.
3. Choose Parkland Regional Library (AB). Click Next.
4. Enter your library card barcode (no spaces) and PIN and check off the I agree to allow hoopla to verify and exchange my hoopla registration information with my public library option. Click Next.
5. Choose whether to receive email notifications and click SIGN ME UP.
6. Browse hoopla's contents. To switch between formats, click Browse at the top of the page and select the format you're looking for.
7. When you find a title you want to borrow, click the cover. Then click Borrow.
8. Your borrowed titles can be found under My Hoopla. Click Play to view.

Titles are only available to stream through the hoopla website. To download on a tablet or smartphone, follow the instructions below.

Using the hoopla App

1. Download the hoopla Digital app from the app store on your device.
2. If you don't have a hoopla account, tap the Sign Up button. You will be asked to allow GPS location. Tap Allow. A second permission screen asking to access device location will appear. Tap Allow.
3. Choose Parkland Regional Library (AB) as your library.
4. In the form, enter your valid email address, create a password, enter your library barcode and PIN and choose Yes, I agree to allow hoopla to verify and exchange my registration information with my public library. You may also agree to receive promotional email communications and notifications from hoopla (optional). Tap Sign Up.
5. To browse titles select a format at the bottom of the app.
6. When you find a title you want to borrow, tap the cover. Then tap Borrow. If the title doesn't automatically begin downloading, tap Download.
7. Once the item has downloaded, you will be able to read/view without Wifi.

Accessing eBooks on a Computer

1. Go to the cloudLibrary website. (Available through www.prl.ab.ca/elibrary)
2. To read an eBook, you will need to install the PC or Mac app. Click *Download App* button in the upper right of the screen.
3. This will take you to the cloudLibrary support site, where you will choose PC App or Mac App on the left side of the screen. Download the app.
4. After the app is downloaded, open the app. Select your Country as Canada (CA), Location/Province as Alberta, and Parkland Regional Library as your library. Enter your library barcode and pin. Accept the legal terms and click *Login*.
5. A pop up box will appear asking you to activate your computer. Choose your activation method and click *Activate*. (Leave it set to *Automatically generate ID for cloudLibrary*, unless you have an Adobe ID you'd prefer to enter.)
6. You can choose books from the *Featured* or *Browse* tabs or complete a search from the Search box.
7. To check out an eBook, click on the cover. Click the green *Borrow* button. The book will automatically download into *My Books*. (You may be asked to download and unzip the eBook file. Click OK to unzip/extract the file.) To start reading your eBook, click the cover.
8. If the book is unavailable, place a hold by clicking the *Add to Hold List* button. To be notified of your hold, click *Settings*. Click *Yes, notify me* and input your email address.

Transferring eBooks to eReaders

1. Follow the steps for accessing eBooks on a computer.
2. Plug your turned-on device into the computer, go to the *My Books* tab in the cloudLibrary app, and click on the *Transfer to Device* button.

Accessing eBooks on your Tablet

1. Access the app store on your device and search for the free cloudLibrary app. Install.
2. Open the app on your device and tap the screen to continue.
3. Select your Country as Canada (CA), Location/Province as Alberta, and Parkland Regional Library as your Library. Enter your library barcode and PIN and tap *Login*.
4. You will be required to accept the EULA, Terms of Use and Privacy policy by tapping *Agree*.
5. Tap *Featured* or *Browse* (three menu lines) to view the library's collection.
6. Tap *My Books* to see your checked out titles. To open and read, tap on the eBook.

Protective Factors

Certain factors help protect and strengthen youth during adolescence

External factors

- Family cohesion, i.e., involvement through shared interests and emotional support
- Positive relationships with other youth and adults
- Academic achievement
- Opportunities to participate in social activities
- Responsibilities for other people or pets
- Adequate care for substance use, physical and mental disorders
- Lack of access to means for suicidal behaviour
- Connection to a religious community

Internal factors

- Sense of belonging
- Sociability, i.e., ability to be a friend
- Love of learning
- Connectedness to school
- Sense of worth and self-confidence
- Self-motivation
- Service, such as community involvement or supporting a cause
- Life skills, such as good decision making, assertiveness, impulse control, coping skills, flexibility and perseverance
- Sense of humour
- Creativity, such as artistic expression
- Spirituality, i.e., faith in something greater

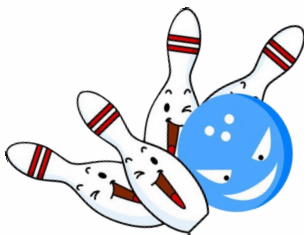

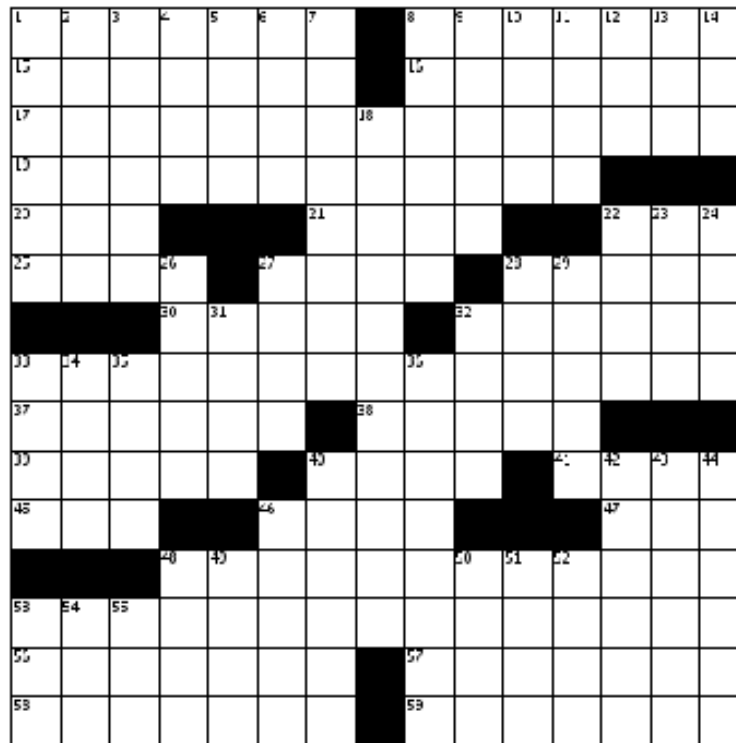
