- To approve revisions to the Service Agreement Policy #1208 (Revisions to sections 6.2.1, 6.3, 6.5 and 10.2).
- To adopt the Protocol for Regional Cooperation as presented as recommended by the Flagstaff Intermunicipal Partnership Committee.
- To support the Flagstaff Intermunicipal Partnership Committee's Work Plan item—Regional Governance Study.
- To maintain the ATCO Electric- Distribution Revenue Franchise fee at 7% for 2015.
- To instruct the CAO to draft a letter to Flagstaff Victims Services for their Victims of Crime Fund Grant application.
- To transfer \$5,146.18 into General Reserves for future use.
