Public library network support

The provincial government also provides network support to enable province-wide sharing of public library resources. Public library network support provided by PLSB totalled nearly \$4,900,000 in 2014-2015 and these numbers are forecasted to be consistent for 2015-2016.

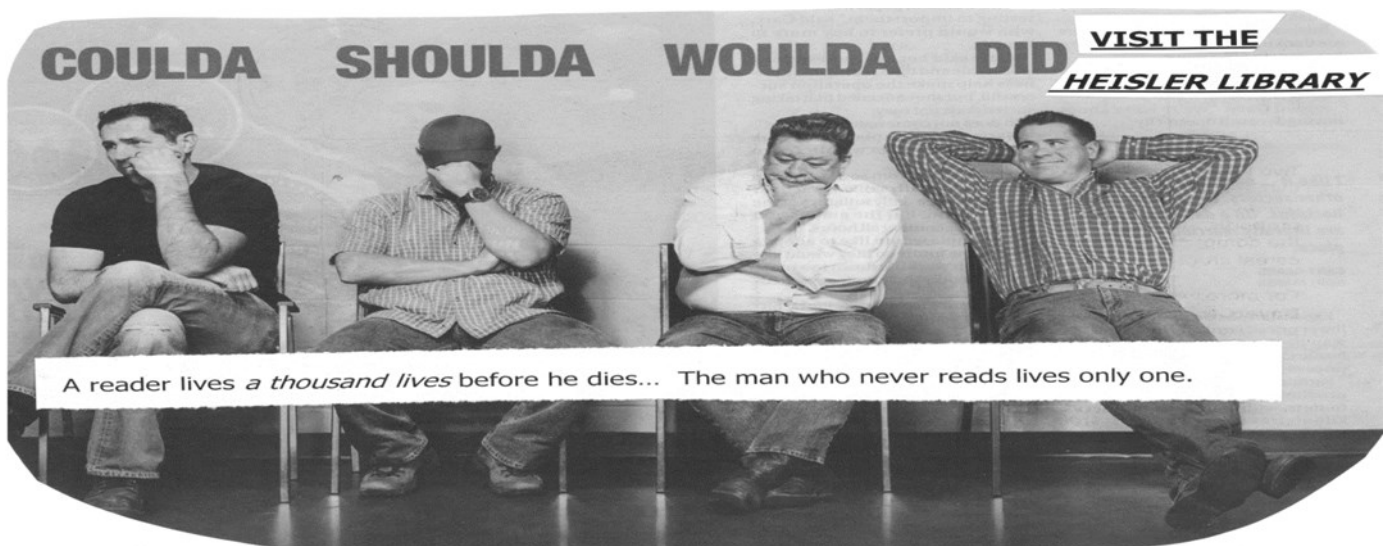
This support in 2014/2015 included:

- \$2,600,000 for SuperNet connectivity for all Alberta public libraries participating in the Public Library Network
- \$750,000 to cover the cost of interlibrary loan delivery via Government Courier
- \$250,000 to The Alberta Library to facilitate access to resources from the academic library sector
- \$150,000 to Chinook Arch Library Board for service to broker province-wide, national and international interlibrary loans from all types of libraries

\$800,000 for public library access to a variety of electronic resources including Hoopla, Zinio, Press Reader and Mango language-learning software

Total Provincial Support

In 2015/2016, total provincial support for public library service (as provided by PLSB) is budgeted at \$36,000,000 (subject to Legislative approval)

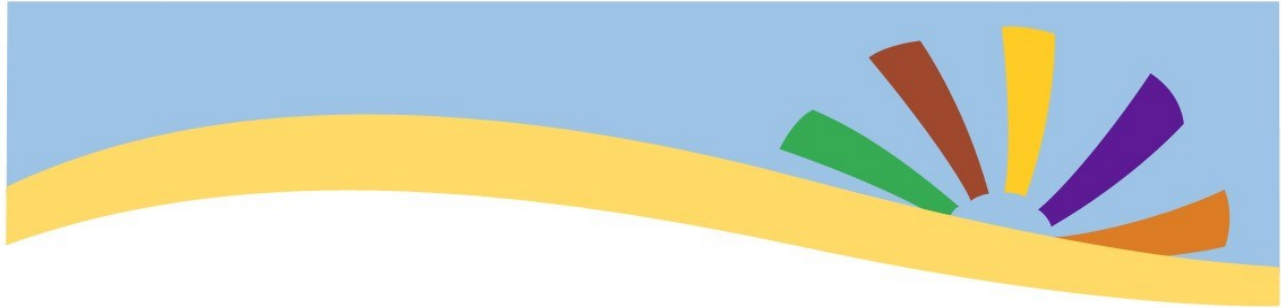

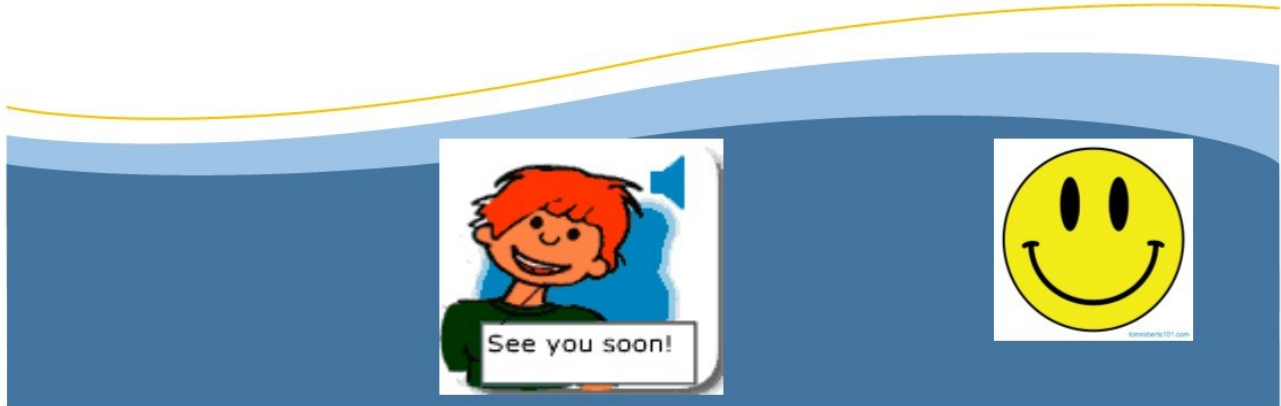
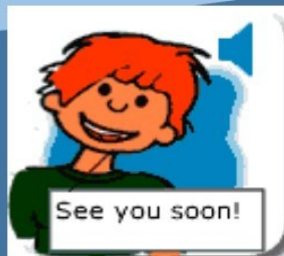
