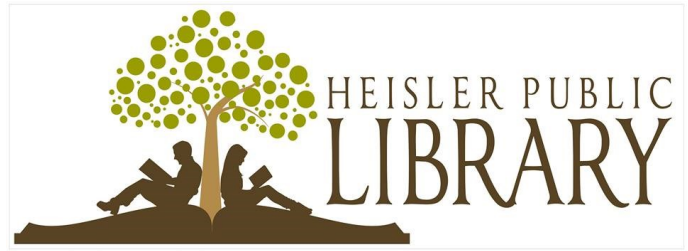

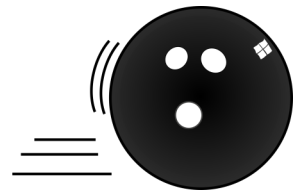

- Full name and maiden name, where born and raised
- Marriages, births, anniversaries
- Where your home was and exact land location
- Parents (names and occupation)
- Brothers and sisters
- Children, name, marriages, births
- Grandparents, names and occupations
- Interesting incidents and events
- Deaths (age, where and when)
- Immigration to Canada (from where, when, reasons and means of transportation)
- Education, religion, occupation or trades
- Names of your neighbours and/or hired help
- Community interests, sports, hobbies, awards and special achievements
- Agriculture, ranching, businesses or government involvement
- Armed forces service: past and present, when and where served
- Natural phenomenon: floods, fires, storms, etc. Include impact on family
- Special stories or memories: favourite memories or best stories about events, incidents or characters in your family, church, club, business or community

Please indicate who has written the story. The publication committee reserves the right to edit your stories for the purpose of length or repetition, however we will keep the stories as close as possible to what you have provided.

There is a great deal of time consuming work involved in assembling a history book after we receive your family histories. So please send your submissions and orders by May 1, 2016 so we can meet our printer's deadline and have it printed and bound for the summer of 2017.

We require a deposit on books you may want to order, to help us with our expenses in creating this book. This will ensure that you will receive all the copies you have ordered. We will not know how many books to order without this guideline. If for some unforeseen reason that we are unable to make the book, your deposit will be returned.
