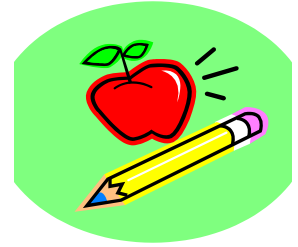

Council Highlights

These are some of the resolutions made at the August 15, 2013 regular council meeting of the Village of Heisler Council:

- To accept the quote from Fort Garry Fire Trucks, Red Deer in the amount of **\$202,500 plus GST** and an additional, **\$22,500 plus GST** for extra equipment at a total cost of **\$225,500 plus GST** for the purchase of a **2013 Freightliner M2 106 Fire Truck**
- To retain the Bylaw #469-12, the Restricted, Vicious and Guard Dog bylaw after reviewing Edmonton, Calgary, Red Deer, Forestburg and Killam's dog bylaws as the reviewed bylaws are not adequate for Heisler's needs
- To decline the ATBOnline Business Access and Services Agreement
- To rescind motion 080/13

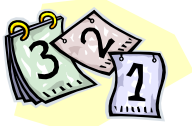

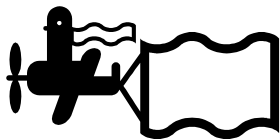

~2013 ELECTION INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS AND POTENTIAL CANDIDATES~

NOMINATIONS PACKAGES ARE NOW AVAILABLE AT THE VILLAGE OFFICE

NOMINATION DAY - Monday September 23, 2013

Eligibility: You are eligible for nomination if you meet ALL of the following criteria:

- 18 years of age on or before Nomination Day
- Canadian citizen
- Must have lived in the Village of Heisler for the 6 consecutive months immediately preceding Election Day
- Are not otherwise ineligible or disqualified

~Nomination forms must be delivered to the Village of Heisler administration office in person.

ELECTION DAY - Monday October 21, 2013

Eligibility – You are eligible to vote if you meet ALL of the following criteria:

- 18 years of age
- Canadian citizen
- Lived in Alberta for 6 consecutive months immediately preceding Election Day
- Resident of the Village of Heisler
- Provided the required proof of eligibility as required by Section 53 of the Local Authorities Election Act.

Note: The above condensed information is provided as assistance to the public only. For exact wording of the legislation, please refer to the Local Authorities Election Act.

The Municipal District of Camrose No. 427 underwent a number of boundary and name changes with the neighbor municipality, the Municipal District of Flagstaff No. 62 (which was originally named as the Municipal District of Killam No. 390).
